2. **Details of Registration:**
 - 2.1 WWAGS is registered under society registration Act XXI of 1860 bearing registration **No. 24 of 16th May 1961.**
 - 2.2 The Organisation is also registered under Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act. 1976 bearing **FCRA No. 194200002** of 29th May 1985.
 - 2.3 The Organisation is registered under **12A-IT Act.** And also eligible for tax exemption under section **80G(5) (vi)** with Director of Income Tax-Exemption of Income Tax Act – 1961.

3. Nature of the organization.

The WWAGS is a nonprofit making, Non Governmental State Level Organisation working for the rural poor women and children in the State of Manipur in particular and extend its activities in North Eastern States under India Water Partnership (IWP) programmed as a convener organization.

4. Brief significant activities:

Integrated sustainable Development programmes through community based social transformation and health care - MCH-HIV/Aids, Safe drinking water supply & Sanitation, Health & Hygiene, eradication of illiterates and avail them of teaching learning materials, ophthalmology care, building up family resources, formation of SHGs, affordable alternative energy resources, capacitation of training to create new local leadership and enhance the levels of quality analysis and management of local issues in remotest- rural & semi urban areas.

4.1. WWAGS initiates to establish **Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS), Institute of Peoples Education**, Thoubal District in the year 2002, first of its kind in the State of Manipur. Under this institute, more than 70 vocational trades have already been introduced in Thoubal District and were trained 15000 numbers of trainees in different vocational trades so far.

4.2. In the year 2015 **Agro Textile Demonstration Centre, Wangjing** under WWAGS in collaboration with Textile Commissioner Mumbai under the supervision of SASMIRA Mumbai has constructed 92 units of Shade Net Houses in 32 villages under the scheme of Promoting the uses of Agro Textiles in North East Region (NEG) by providing Agro Kits for protecting Agricultural practices to the poor farmers of the Region out of total units of 154 to be constructed.

The scheme provided two types of structures having the same design. In case of 65 units, the Shade Net House is 500sq. meters with vermicomposting unit in 100 sq. meters, with two vermibeds. For this unit a farmer provided 10% share of Rs. 49,300/- out of total amount of Rs. 4,93,000/- (i.e. 90 % share by Textile Commissioner, Mumbai)

And in case of 27 units, the Shade Net House is 500 sq. metres with ground cover in 500 sq. metres; providing a water pump for irrigation facilities. For this unit a farmer provided 10% share of Rs. 48,300/- out of total amount of Rs. 4,83,000/- (i.e. 90% share by Textile Commissioner, Mumbai). At present the farmers have started planting of different crops.

4.3. In the year 2017 **Two(2) AHVY Projects under Ministry of Textiles** awarded to WWAGS for the welfare of 1000 artisans in Bishnupur District, MANIPUR.

9. 9.1 Background of the Organization:

✦ **WANGJING WOMEN AND GIRLS SOCIETY (WWAGS)**, (Rural Development Services) is an organisation formed on the 22nd Dec. 1958. The idea of existence of WWAGS came in the mind of the young and educated men and women after the 2nd World War which affected a lot of people. A lot of people died unnaturally due to the lack of food and using open tank water for drinkable purposes since they were not aware the importance of hygiene. Seeing such conditions, some local volunteers started working in the area of development and the WWAGS cooperated with a single mind in order to fulfill their aims since the working was started for the people in the rural in accessible areas particularly women and girls of the weaker section of the society.

The WWAGS is a non-profit making, non-political, non-religious organisation and the members having the dedicated spirit in the field of public help, sticking to secularism on true democratic ground started working. The WWAGS emphasized on the income generating programmes and social upliftment of the women and girls in the rural areas particularly the destitute and aged women. Such women are provided food, vitamins, fruits and essential commodities in cooperation with the local organisations, associations, clubs and Mahila Mandals. Regarding income generating programme, WWAGS took up programmes both in valley and hills. The WWAGS has completed some projects like income generating programme, social forestry, Adult Education, Health and Sanitation and benefited a large no. of women, men and girls in Thoubal and Chandel District. In the hill areas, income generating programmes such as

Piggery, Weaving, Social Forestry, Banana Plantation, Pineapple Plantation etc. were taken up so that they can meet their financial needs. With the aim of self employment, increasing employment opportunities for rural women living below the poverty line by upgrading and strengthening their activities WWAGS benefited men and women in the rural areas.

In recognition of its outstanding contribution in the field of Adult Education with the aims of literacy for all in India by 2000 A.D., WWAGS was honored with the **UNESCO - National Literacy Mission (NLM) Award 1998**, for outstanding contribution in the field of Adult Literacy on the 4th Feb. 1999 at New Delhi, Chaired by former Minister of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India and Prof. Federico Mayor, Director General, UNESCO, France and also WWAGS was honored the **State Best Volunteer Award 2004** by the All Manipur NGOs Forum, Manipur. The WWAGS is a State Level Organization working particularly in the state of Manipur but for the last 7years it has been working in 8 states of North Eastern Region of India in the fields of North East India Zonal Water Partnership (NEIZWP) as a Convener under Global Water Partnership and India Water Partnership.

2. STEP Project covering 13 villages for 700 women beneficiary at Two Blocks of Thoubal District and 40 Crech Centre covering 1000 children at Thoubal District under Ministry of Women and Child Development, GOI.

3. Agro Textile Project for poor farmers at Thoubal District target to cover 700 beneficiaries under SASMIRA Mumbai, Ministry of Textile, GOI.

4. Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS), Institute of Peoples education for all dropouts and educationally backwards beneficiaries of Thoubal District since 2002 under Ministry of Human Resource Development, GOI.
